Cardboard recycling just became more convenient in Summit County. Residents can now recycle "OCC" old corrugated cardboard and telephone books along with paper in their own community.

Reduce Household Chemicals



All Purpose Cleaner: Mix 1 qt. water, 4 tsp. baking soda and ½ c. vinegar or mix lemon juice with water in a spray bottle.

Glass cleaner: Mix 1-3 tsp. of vinegar or lemon juice to 1 quart of water in a spray bottle.

Laundry: Bleach Alternative - 1c. Baking soda & 1 c. lemon juice or 1c. Baking soda & 1c. peroxide

Soap scum: Shower doors/windows: Add 2 Tbsp. lemon juice to a spray bottle filled with ¾ c. vinegar and ¼ c. water.
